FUNCTION OF JOB Under the general supervision of the superintendent and the

immediate supervision of the building principal and assistant Superintendent

LENGTH OF CONTRACT 180 days; start and end times based on building-level needs/programs

DUTIES

- 1. Work elementary and adolescent-age students to achieve grade level competency in all areas of reading, writing, mathematics, and achievement testing skills
- 2. Provide students with the necessary skills to be a life-long learner
- 3. Ensures that each student within the program, through direct instructional support and guidance, is achieving one year's academic growth on the state assessments
- 4. Ensures that each student within the program, through direct instructional support and guidance, is achieving reasonable levels of increased ongoing success on local assessments throughout the school year
- 5. Implement the objectives of a comprehensive intervention program that supports the regular classroom instruction
- 6. Develop individualized intervention plans, based on the guidance of the classroom teacher, that will meet the needs of the at-risk learners
- 7. Support the goals and objectives outline in a student's reading improvement and monitoring plan and/or individualized intervention plan as they align to state and local requirements
- 8. Utilize different assessment techniques and work with teachers to identify students in need of the skills program
- 9. Utilize current best-practice instructional approaches and resources when working with students
- 10. Utilize technology as an instructional and assessment tool
- 11. Design and implement appropriate intervention opportunities that effectively meet the needs of the students
- 12. Conduct program orientations for students/parents throughout the school year, when needed
- 13. Communicate with parents, schools and teaching staff on the progress of each student in the program on a routine basis
- 14. Assist with building-level and district-wide testing and assessment programs by administering, proctoring, scoring, interpreting, and analyzing testing and assessment information
- 15. Assist with developing and coordinating building-level intervention-based trainings, reflections, Title I parent meetings and special events
- 16. Analyze assessment data and complete beginning, mid-year and final assessment reports
- 17. Recommend special assessments for students as needed

- 18. Develop plans for home support and/or summer learning programs for all students as needed
- 19. Serve on building level committees and teams (such as, but not limited to RTI teams)
- 20. Maintain a database that keeps record of the individual students served in the program, their assessment results, the interventions used, the results of those interventions, and the duration of their attendance in the program.
- 21. Maintain an inventory of the educational learning environment materials, equipment, and resources
- 22. Attend in-service opportunities as appropriate or directed by administration and/or supervisor
- 23. Perform other duties that are assigned by the administration after the adoption of this job description.

- 4. Must have an in-depth understanding of current educational practices and strategies for working with at-risk learners.
